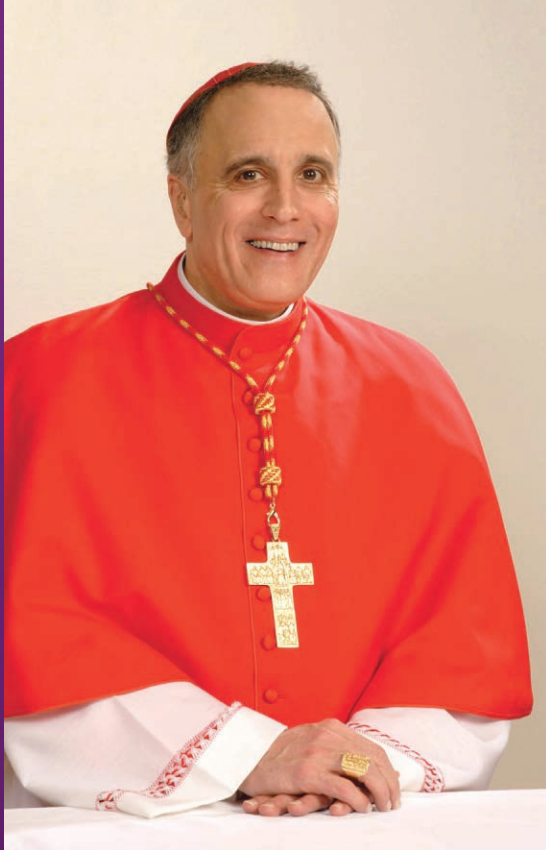

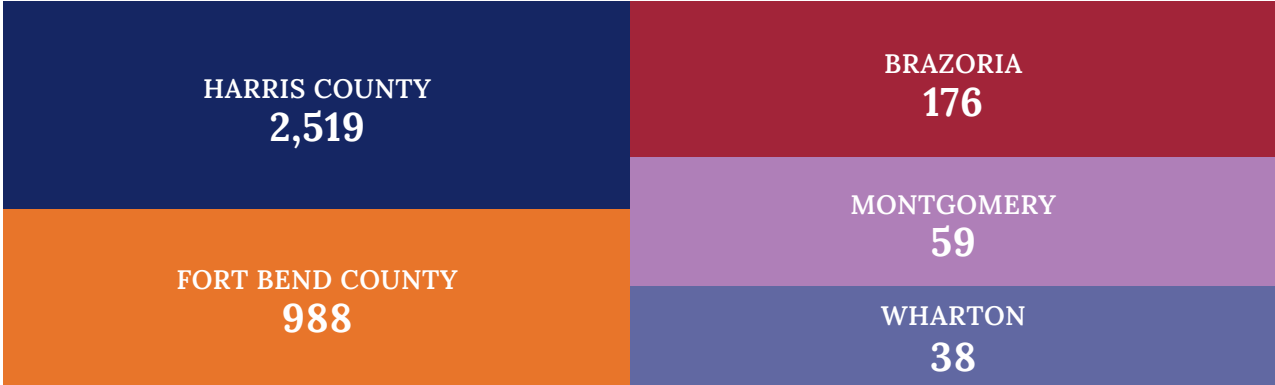

IMPACT REPORT

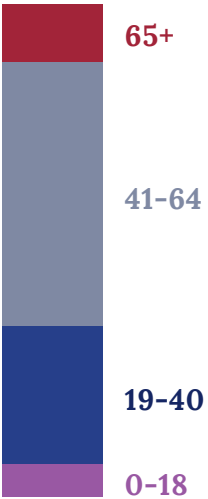
Texas leads the nation in uninsured residents, and the uninsured rate in Houston is 26%, more than double the national average.

TOP 5 COUNTIES



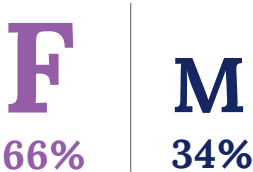
PATIENT AGE

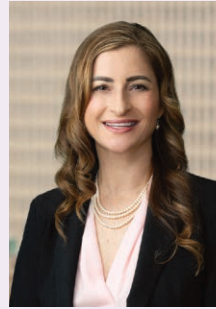

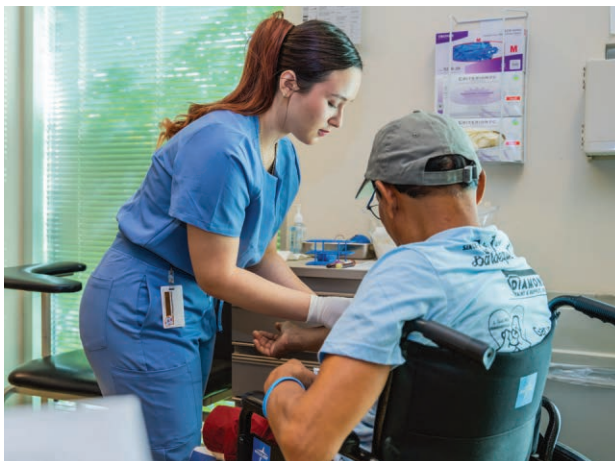

MISSION

The mission of San José Clinic is to provide healing through quality healthcare and education with respect and compassion for those with limited access to care.

San José Clinic was founded in 1922 with the vision of Monsignor George Walsh, a donation of \$59 from the Charity Guild of Catholic Women, and the service of community volunteers, who all came together with the same hope of breaking down barriers to healthcare for the underserved. For over a century, the Clinic has grown from a small frame house to a healthcare facility with two locations, and it has become one of the leading providers of quality healthcare services for the uninsured, uninsurable, and underserved in the Greater Houston area.

Today, we proudly uphold the legacy of our founders by continuing to fight for health equity and ensure access to health by providing healthcare for those who need a health home the most, including primary and specialty medical and dental care, as well as vision, laboratory, and pharmacy services. San José Clinic is a ministry of the Archdiocese of Galveston-Houston, a Texas Medical Center member institution, and a United Way partner.

Turning to San José Clinic in Midtown Houston, a place where he and his family has received care for years, proved to be a turning point. After meeting with his primary care physician, Dr. Fernandez, Oscar learned to recognize signs of heat-related illness and how to protect himself against it. The Clinic's pharmacy also provided him with hydrating electrolyte packets, a crucial lifeline for his physically demanding job.

"If it wasn't for San José Clinic, I wouldn't be here today," said Oscar Rodriguez. "Dr. Fernandez is the best doctor I've ever found. She always checks me thoroughly, and if she sees anything wrong, she immediately sends me to get the necessary tests or treatment. Thanks to her care, I feel way better and I am confident that I will be able to live a long and healthy life with my family."

With renewed hope and guidance, Oscar left the Clinic, better equipped to face the challenges of his profession and safeguard his health amidst the Texas sun.



Sandra P. Martinez

Community Relations and Outreach Coordinator

In steadfast commitment to our nonprofit mission, Sandra P. Martinez has been a linchpin of our team since 2023, specializing in providing vital resources for underserved communities, refugees, migrant populations, and crisis case management. Currently serving as the Community Relations and Outreach Coordinator at San José Clinic, Sandra plays a pivotal role in elevating education and support for our patients, providers, and partners, focusing on five major areas: community connection, education, empowerment, collaboration and partnership, and outreach.

As we reflect on the accomplishments of 2023, Sandra's contributions stand out:

- **83 Outreach Events:** Sandra led the coordination of 83 impactful outreach events, fostering community engagement and strengthening our ties with the populations we serve.
- **18 Breast Cancer Events:** A total of 18 events were organized to raise awareness about breast cancer, emphasizing our commitment to holistic healthcare and preventative education.
- **Completion of DPP Cohort 1:** The successful execution of the Diabetes Prevention Program (DPP) Cohort 1 reflects our dedication to promoting health and wellness within the community.
- **250+ Patient Referral Encounters:** Sandra facilitated over 250 patient referral encounters, ensuring seamless access to healthcare resources for those in need.

Sandra P. Martinez's efforts encapsulate the essence of our mission, making a tangible impact on the well-being of individuals and communities. For example, she facilitates the Food RX Delivery program that provides patients with chronic diseases impacted by diet with produce delivery to their homes twice a month. Her commitment to service and advocacy is instrumental in furthering the goals and objectives of San José Clinic.

Furthermore, we acknowledge the invaluable partnerships that have made Sandra's programs possible. Collaborations with The Houston Food Bank, Tigerlily Foundation, and Direct Relief have significantly contributed to the success of our outreach initiatives, reinforcing our collective dedication to enhancing community health and well-being.

San José Clinic Fort Bend Pharmacy Expansion

In 2022, San José Clinic received its two largest grants in Clinic history, totaling \$3.1 million. This funding expanded services at the Fort Bend County Clinic, including dental care and Disease State Management, and the opening of a class-A pharmacy. Among the grants was a \$1.54 million 3-year investment designated for the pharmacy expansion.

On October 10th, 2023, the Fort Bend Pharmacy officially opened its doors, marking a pivotal moment in the Clinic's history. This pharmacy in semi-rural Rosenberg helps move the needle on health equity by mitigating transportation barriers so patients can access life-saving medications.

From its opening to the end of 2023, the satellite pharmacy made a tangible impact, dispensing over 1,000 prescriptions to 228 patients, and continues to grow. This newly established pharmacy underscores San José Clinic's commitment to identifying needs and acting to advance the health and well-being of the medically underserved.





3rd Annual Reception for Msgr. Walsh Donor Society
